

#### REACHING OUT IN THE COMMUNITY

Outreach is an important part to promoting library services and allows library staff to put faces to those services and share the library's mission. Funds from this group helped support these opportunities.

Since late April we've had many successful opportunities, including:

- On April 23, library staff had a booth at the Little Apple Pride Fest, where an estimated 750 people came by the library booth.
- Between April 21 May 17, library staff visited nearby schools and hosted library tours to promote Summer Reading. Thanks to their efforts the total participants in the kids program is in the thousands!
- June 4, library staff attended the Riley County Health Department's "Community Baby Shower" and over 150 parents/parents-to-be attended the event. We gave out library information and a free board book.
- On the evening of May 10, library staff were invited to give a presentation to several Afghan families, the presentation included how to get a library card, the benefits of having a card, and more. The presentation resulted in 13 parents and kids getting library cards that evening.
- On June 18, library staff attended the Manhattan Juneteenth celebration at City Park. While in attendance library staff gave out library swag, free books, put up the 140 Years of Soul panels, and more.

#### **NEW ADDITIONS AT YOUR LIBRARY**

The Manhattan Public Library continues to adapt and expand with new resources and opportunities. In the last few months the library has add several new additions in all areas of the library. In the Children's Room, the new Wonderbooks collection was made available. These are books with an audio player on the front inside

cover. The audio player reads through the book with the reader and the reader select a learning mode that asks questions about the title to help with reading comprehension and facilitate conversation about the book.

A new virtual reality experience has been brought to the Teen Zone, by the end of the month, teens will have access to the popular *Oculus* headset.

If you're looking for a new titles to read, the Staff Picks display is back. Next time you visit the library, stop by the Holds Corner and browse what library staff recommends. It was so popular in May, that a total of 70 Staff Picks were checked out!

Lastly, through the generous funding provided by the *Greater Manhattan Community Foundation*, the library will soon be offering a special grant writing resource, also known as *Grant Station*. 

Memorial books were later chosen in their honor and are available to check out at the library.


